## WHAT HAPPENS TO MY FOOD WASTE? RECYCLED VS. BINNED



- Food waste is collected separately in its own container. You can use a compostable liner, or just rinse after emptying.
- Indoor caddies are emptied into a larger outdoor bin and collected weekly.
   The trucks are powered by recycled food waste that has been turned into biogas!



The trucks transport food
 waste to a specialist facility
 in London, where it's composted
 under high temperatures, turning
 it into biogas and fertiliser.



- Biogas is a 100% renewable, carbon neutral alternative to oil and natural gas.
  - It's used to generate electricity and even used as fuel for the recycling trucks!

- Food waste that goes into the black bin makes the bin very heavy and smelly. It has to be changed more often and more plastic bags will be used.
- Black bins are usually collected less often than recycling bins.
  This is to encourage more recycling. Trucks take the rubbish to a transfer station in West London.



• The waste is then burned under controlled conditions to generate electricity - around 1.2 tonnes of CO2 is generated per tonne of waste that is burned.
